

## 2009 WILLIAM M. FANNING MAINTENANCE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The National Business Aviation Association annually awards \$5,000 to two applicants (who receive \$2,500 each) pursuing careers as maintenance technicians. One award will benefit a student who currently is enrolled in an accredited airframe & powerplant (A&P) program at an approved FAR Part 147 school. The second award will benefit an individual who currently is not enrolled but has been accepted for enrollment in an A&P program.

Awards will be made to U.S. citizens without regard to sex, race, religion or national origin. Scholarships will be awarded at the NBAA 62nd Annual Meeting & Convention in 2009, and checks will be made payable to the school. Scholarship recipients must use the funds by December 31, 2010, or risk forfeit of the award.

The scholarship is named in honor of retired NBAA Staff member William M. Fanning, who was active in maintenance issues during his nearly 20-year tenure at the Association.

### APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Applicant must be a U.S. citizen.
2. Applicant either must be officially enrolled in an accredited A&P program, or have been accepted for enrollment by an approved FAR Part 147 school. Proof of enrollment or acceptance of enrollment must be provided prior to the distribution of the award.
3. Fill out this application form in its entirety and sign it.
4. Submit a 250-word, typed, double-spaced essay describing your interest in and goals for a career in the aviation maintenance field. Your typed name must appear at the top of the page.
5. If currently enrolled, submit an official transcript. If not currently enrolled but accepted for enrollment, submit a copy of a letter of acceptance.
6. Submit a current one-page resume with permanent home address.
7. Submit a letter of recommendation from either a faculty member or other individual who is familiar with your capabilities. A letter of recommendation from an NBAA Member Company representative is encouraged but not required.
8. Completed application package, which includes this form, one essay, one transcript or acceptance letter, one resume and one letter of recommendation, must be received by NBAA no later than **July 31, 2009**, to be considered for the scholarship.
